


Time 4 Truth

Week of May 4, 2014



Monday

"Trust in the LORD with all your heart, And lean not on your own understanding; In all your ways acknowledge Him, And He shall direct your paths." (Proverbs 3:5–6, NKJV)

Learning the Truth:

Trust God more than your own thoughts and ideas. Seek God and He will direct your paths of life.

Living the Truth:

Tell God how much you trust Him. Then ask Him to reveal His will and your willingness to follow.

Tuesday

"He has shown you, O man, what is good;
And what does the LORD require of you
But to do justly, To love mercy,
And to walk humbly with your God?"

(Micah 6:8, NKJV)

Learning the Truth:

God's requirements are to act right, love mercy, and live humbly with God.

Living the Truth:

Commit to live for the Lord while showing mercy because you have been shown mercy.

Wednesday

"Repent therefore and be converted, that your sins may be blotted out, so that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord," (Acts 3:19, NKJV)

Learning the Truth:

To be converted, forgiven, and refreshed you must turn from your ways and live for God.

Living the Truth:

Decide right now to turn from that hidden sin you struggle with and do not return to it.

Thursday

"My son, do not despise the chastening of the LORD,

Nor be discouraged when you are rebuked by Him;

For whom the LORD loves He chastens, And scourges every son whom He receives." (Hebrews 12:5–6, NKJV)

Learning the Truth:

You are loved because you are disciplined.

Living the Truth:

Happily receive discipline from God based on the fact that He loves and has received you to

"Your word is a lamp unto my feet and a light to my path." (Psalm 119:105, NKJV)

Friday

"Furthermore, we have had human fathers who corrected us, and we paid them respect. Shall we not much more readily be in subjection to the Father of spirits and live? For they indeed for a few days chastened us as seemed best to them,

but He for our profit, that we may be partakers of His holiness. Now no chastening seems to be joyful for the present, but painful; nevertheless, afterward it yields the peaceable fruit of righteousness to those who have been trained by it."

(Hebrews 12:9-11, NKJV)

Meaning of Truth:

Divine discipline develops holiness. The pain of discipline produces rightness in our lives.

Living the Truth:

Accept discipline knowing that it comes from a good God for the purpose of our goodness.

Saturday

"By humility and the fear of the LORD Are riches and honor and life." (Proverbs 22:4, NKJV)

Meaning of Truth:

Riches, honor, and life come only by submission to the LORD.

Living the Truth:

Think less of yourself and receive more of life, or think more of yourself and receive less. Live for the Lord.
